

Some History: 30 Cedarcliff Road, Biltmore Forest, North Carolina

This elegant Tudor-style home was built in 1922 by Mr. Francis Tench Cox and his wife, Anita who wanted a home that reminded her of her native England. This house was featured in a Biltmore Estate Company advertisement in the early 1920's that showed a collection of mansions already constructed in the new Biltmore Forest development. The house is believed to have been designed by Charles N. Parker, who also designed the Grove Arcade and was known for his fine Tudor style home design.

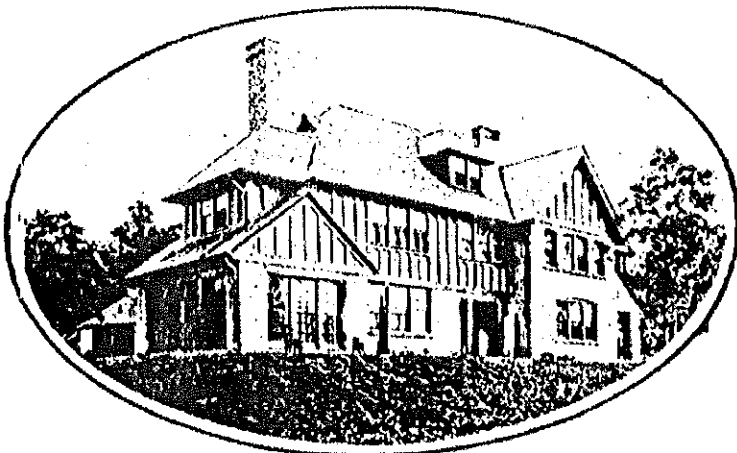
Originally, the house had no veranda in front. However, one was added sometime later.

The garage now has a modern rolling door. There is an efficiency apartment toward the rear of the garage which was refurbished in 2000.

The third floor was designed as quarters for a butler and a maid, having two bedrooms and a full bath.

The Coxes had twin five-year-old daughters. The little house at the back of the property

was a stable that housed twin ponies for the girls and a milk cow. The stable was rebuilt in 2005 when electricity was added.
